BARGAINING KICKS OFF WITH A BANG!

OPEN BARGAINING: WHY WE INSIST!

In 2023, GEO members made an important decision: no more bargaining behind closed doors. We waged a long fight to open our negotiations to all graduate students. HR tried its best to resist—to prevent grads from witnessing the university's hypocrisy firsthand—but after months of organizing, we won open bargaining.

As a result, over a 1,000 graduate students were able to attend bargaining sessions and participate in the development of a new contract that improved wages, healthcare, and working conditions for many of us.

This cycle, HR proposed ground rules for bargaining that again severely limit who is allowed to participate. These rules reduce the number of attendees allowed in the room and on Zoom; restrict participation to GSIs and GSSAs; and require attendees to provide HR with their names to gain admission.

This proposal offers a more limited form of open bargaining than we won in 2023; it shows us that HR is afraid of letting us all into the room.

We responded to this proposal by reiterating our commitment to negotiations open to all interested parties, without any caveats—telling HR that, like last time, we are ready to fight for open bargaining. Despite dragging their feet, HR responded by accusing us of delaying negotiations. The state mediator, requested by HR, also suggested that fighting over open bargaining was "boring" to union members.

But these are just excuses; we know it is not "boring" to win a seat at the table for all workers. The 150+ grads who showed up to the room this past Friday weren't bored—they were powerful, and HR knows it.

On Friday morning, 150+ graduate workers showed up to the small room HR had booked for our first bargaining session. We sat on the floor, filled the corridors, and joined in remotely through Zoom. In our first caucus, we came to a consensus: we'll make decisions together, and we won't enter into any closed-door sidebars with HR.

Over the course of the morning, HR moved us to an even smaller room; then refused inperson talks to dodge being recorded; sent a 'neutral' mediator to push a proposal that aims to introduce new forms of surveillance over GEO members and lays the groundwork to rollback class-size protections; and finally, they refused to discuss urgent issues regarding international workers' safety.
